Lessons Learned as First Time Caravan Leaders

Like many of you, Lori and I had heard of the Ores, Shores, Waters, & Lights (OSWL) Caravan that Norm Hewer, Past International President, and his late wife Lucile had developed, but, was no longer running. Having grown up in Michigan and knowing the beauty and offerings of Michigan's Upper Peninsula, we were interested in assisting experienced caravan leaders in bringing the caravan back to life.




Our first step was to participate in WBCCI Caravan Leaders training. This training is put on by Chuck Kiple, Caravan Committee Chairman and Marion Pember, Chairman, WBCCI Caravan Promotions. Once our training was complete, we needed to track down experienced caravan leaders who we could assist and learn from. This is when we met Michigan Unit's Norm & Jinny Kiel. They'd led the OSWL caravan for several years. They graciously opened their home to us and listened to our request to assist them in bringing the OSWL's caravan back to life. This meeting didn't go exactly as planned. Norm & Jinny advised us that their days of leading caravans were behind them; however, they graciously agreed to go along as our assistants, and supplied us with the driver's manual they had used when they led the caravan, so that we could scout the trip.



The caravan was originally designed to travel the entire Upper Peninsula in 17 days with 7 stops. When we scouted the trip, we noted the pace was very quick. As an example, following our scouting trip, in a meeting with Norm & Jinny, we made a comment along the lines of, "We noticed the parking crew left at 7 am. They must have had to be up by 6 am to get ready to leave?" Jinny responded, "Oh no. We were up by 5 am." They were clearly serious and as impressed as we were by the former leaders and participant's heartiness, we thought it might be more enjoyable to all if we slowed things down. We made a

proposal to split the caravan into two halves, east and west, and cover half of the Upper Peninsula in 15 days, with 5 stops. Norm & Jinny are to be commended for their willingness to go along with our plans to change a schedule they were so familiar with.

This is where some of the bigger work of leading a caravan begins. We needed to write a whole new drivers manual, which included a new route and two new stops. It also caused us to take a closer look at the meal format. In the past, meals were prepared by a rotating group of assigned Caravanners who would purchase ingredients, prepare the meal, and do the cleanup. In an informal discussion with members of our Metro-Detroit Unit, the overwhelming majority preferred eating at restaurants, instead of Caravanners doing all of the cooking and cleanup. Based on this feedback, we also changed the caravan's meal format. This was quite an undertaking, but, the feedback we received was quite complementary.



The best part of the caravan is getting to meet and know new people. The first persons to sign up for our caravan were our Region President, Gary Olinger and his wife Shryl. Being new at this, we really appreciated their support and the opportunity to spend more time with them. By the time of our rendezvous, our group consisted of Caravanners from 10 different states.

Caravanners are so helpful and we were blessed to have a number of very experienced caravan leaders as part of our group. While we received incredible assistance from all of the Caravanners, special acknowledgment needs to be given to Marion & Carol Pember, Jim & Mary Ann Chellman, and Jim & Sheila Skipper. These folks went above and beyond in providing assistance.

Michigan's Upper Peninsula is such a beautiful location with so many wonderful sights and activities. It's a pleasure to show it off to persons that haven't been blessed with the opportunity to experience it, or, haven't had the opportunity to travel there in a long time. If you haven't yet had the opportunity to read Marion Pember's article about this caravan, in the Blue Beret, we'd encourage you to do so. Marion is a very talented writer, photographer, and as we discovered, an unheralded amateur rock hound.

This caravan will be running again in 2016. Start date: Saturday, September 10, 2016. Stop date: Saturday, September 24, 2016. We are currently confirming caravanners from last year's standby list. 
Bright Shiny Things

Being Airstreamers it's a given we are attracted to shiny things. If you are travelling in the California - Nevada area you may run across some really shiny stuff at the Ivanpah Solar installation.

Located in California near the border with Nevada, the installation is a one of a kind Solar Energy system that uses an immense field of Heliostats



(Mirrors) that focus the sun to collectors at the top of three towers.



At the towers the collectors use the sun to create steam that is piped to turbines and generate electricity. The installation also features thermal storage units that make use of a Molten Salt system for storing heat. The storage system extends the length of the generation system.

As you travel north on I-15 in California toward Las Vegas, the installation is visible from the road and looks like a lake Bed, but the mirrors give it a strange appearance.

The system was activated in 2014 and the operating companies say the first year has been part of a planned learning experience that extends to 2018. Production during 2014 was behind projections but the company says production is at 170% of goal in 2015. The system is the first of its kind and was the only collection type system until the recent announcement of a similar system under construction in China.

Rally/Convention Parking Passes will be mailed beginning April 1st, 2016.

Rally/Convention Fees for registrations received prior to January 1, 2016, will be \$450 for couples, \$400 for singles, and \$100 for each additional adult. Rally/Convention fees for the first 500 registrants include FULL HOOK-UP. After 500, limited services will be available.

Rally Fees received after January 1, 2016, will be \$470.00 for couples, \$420 for singles, and \$120 for additional adults. Through the courtesy of Airstream, Inc., all members registering on or before January 1, 2016, will be eligible to participate in a drawing for up to a total of \$2,000.00 in awards. The award may be redeemed at any Airstream Dealership or at the Jackson Center Service Facility for parts and service.

Free parking in the Bull Pen, with no services, is permitted for the night before your parking date. Additional nights prior to your park date will be at the rate of \$25.00/night, payable at verification.

FEE REFUND POLICY All rally/convention fee refund requests must be postmarked by **May 15, 2016**, and **must** include the complete Rally pass. All cancellations will be assessed a \$30.00 administrative fee. There will be no refunds if postmarked after May 15, except as approved by the International Rally Committee.


