The Canfield and Youngstown areas will provide our Region 4 visitors some truly fun times. Listed below are the Tours we will have the opportunity to go to during our Region 4 rally.

1. White House Fruit Farm: This market has an Amish feel to it. There is about any fruit or vegetable you can imagine. They are known for their Blueberry donuts and rightly so. Light walking and everything is easily accessed.



2. Mastropietro Winery: This winery has music on Friday night. Picnics are



welcome Sunday afternoons by their small lake. There are plenty of places outside to sit and enjoy the countryside. Their wine is excellent. Light walking and everything is easily accessed.

3. Diletto Winery: Have you ever tried the ancient drink 'Mead'. This honey wine spirit is available. Light Walking with one staircase to climb.

4. Youngstown Historical Center of Industry and Labor: This museum is open Wed - Sat and has very limited parking. Car Pooling is a must. The museum will talk about how to make steel, the steel industry in the Youngstown area, and its eventual demise. You can either take a tour or go on your own. The tours will take about an hour. I like to read everything and it took my Wife and I about 2.5 hours to go through it. Tour signups will be held at the rally. Moderate walking with several floors.



5. Butler Institute of American Art: This art Museum is fantastic. There is moderate walking involved because it has several floors.



6. The ARMS Family Museum: This house is about 3 houses down from the Butler Institute of Art and is worth seeing. The house interior is unlike anything you have ever seen. One room looks like you were transported back to the Middle Ages. Light to Moderate walking with several floors to transverse.


7. Lanterman's Mill and Covered Bridge: The mill produces flour which you can purchase. The mill has 7 floors with a lot of stairs. This is a

Heavy walking tour. From the parking lot to the mill is about 100 yards of stone and wood path. It is my favorite excursion of all. The additional Gorge hike is a Heavy hike with wood stairs and some areas of uneven stone path. This hike is well worth it and about a mile/1.5 mile long. If you think you will have trouble walking this excursion, you will.

8. Mill Creek Park: This park is a true jewel. It has easy walking paths with tiered sections of flowers. It is Very well done. Light walking.

Hmmm, this could be a problem

Spring is upon us and its time to de-winterize. Need to get that antifreeze out and sanitize. So, hook up to the dump outlet and pull the handle ==========→




Uh-Oh! So now what? You still need to get that valve

open and get the sanitizing started, so you grab the vice grips and yank on the valve rod – yep that does it. But the idea of spending the season pulling with vice grips isn't all that attractive, need to find a better solution.

- 1. Hey, I think I still have the left over parts from replacing the gate valves, and that included handles. Not the classic look of the old handle, but maybe it can be rigged up to work. Eureka, the thread on the Valterra handle is the same as the thread on the original extension rod on the trailer. Screws right on. Looks like doo-doo, but it's easier than vice grips. Of course, the original retention clips for the handle aren't' even close to working with this handle.
- 2. Google it. Yes, the original Thetford style handle is available. Two sources in a quick search, Silver Trailer Supply in Utah, and Out-of-Doors Mart in North Carolina. I've ordered through Out of Doors Mart on other items, so they get the order. At about \$12 plus shipping, guess I'll get two the original held up for 28 years, so that's about a buck a year that sounds affordable.
