Michigan State Rally

Wednesday night was opening ceremony and Thursday was an all day tour in Muskegon. First we went to the ship yards where the LST 393 was docked. The USS LST 393 Veterans Museum is one of only two LSTs remaining in the U.S., from more than 1,051 that were built and put into service during WW2. LST 393 earned three battle stars during WW2 for the invasions of Sicily, Italy and Omaha Beach at Normandy, France, on D-Day in 1944.



After that we drove down to where the USS Silversides Submarine Museum was located. The most famous surviving submarine of WW2 is the USS Silversides SS236. She sunk more ships (30 Japanese vessels and damaged 14) and took down more tonnage than any other surviving WW2 submarine. She rescued 2 American pilots and laid 16 mines on separate patrols. The very first appendectomy ever performed on a submarine by a Pharmacist Mate was performed in the ward room of SILVERSIDES and was depicted in the movie *Destination Tokyo*, starring Cary Grant. The movie *Below* was filmed onboard SILVERSIDES.

All of our tours were put together by Norm Kiel. A very big Thank You to Norm!

Evening entertainment that evening was Lt. Colonel Jim Keil - My Hike of the Appalachian Trail.

Friday morning we had a delightful breakfast of Oatmeal and Ice Cream (I felt like a kid again having Ice Cream for breakfast). The tour that day was Heritage Park. Evening entertainment was Rick Reuther who was born and raised primarily in Michigan. Rick began performing music at an early age and in addition to singing, has worked professionally as a composer, guitarist, actor and voiceover artist.

Saturday we had the hobby show and flea market to spend our money on and entertain us until a wonderful dinner of chicken, cheesy potatoes and corn.

At the last minute the Camp Park owners offered us a hayride in which many of us went on. After that we had the usual announcements and door prizes. Every unit attending went home with a door prize. Closing ceremony with retiring the flags was held and for hospitality that evening cheese cake was served!

IBT Notes

Below is a summary of IBT Meetings held at the 58th International Rally in Farmington, NM.

Gary Olinger, Region 4 President, represented the Region with the support of Don Hetzler, Region 4 1st Vice President, and Karen Fisher, Region 4 2nd Vice President.

June 25, 2015.

Motion 1 was to strikeout Bylaws and Policy, Article IV, Membership and Membership Privileges, Bylaws, Section 10, Policy, Page 10 and replace it with a revised Lifetime Membership Policy. Motion passed. See additional information in a separate article in this newsletter.



Motion 2 was to remove Bylaws and Policy, Appendix 1 in its entirety. Motion passed. Note that this appendix included information regarding Lifetime (Joint Life Expectancy Table, WBCCI One-Time Lifetime Membership Fees, and the Lifetime Membership Application). These were all replaced with Motion 1 and deleting this appendix puts all the Lifetime Membership information in one place under the policy.

Motion 3 was to change the composition of the Lifetime Membership Fund Committee to be the International 3rd President elected in the odd-numbered year who shall serve a two year term as Committee Chairman. A minimum of two additional members shall be selected from the Region Presidents, Vice Presidents, or the membership by the committee chair. Motion passed.

Motion 4 was to allow the transfer of funds from the Lifetime Membership Fund to the General Fund as directed by the Executive Committee. (Previously this was allowed only once per year and if payment of unit dues or MAL dues was late, the money could not be transferred for that member for that year). Motion passed.

Motion 5 was withdrawn.

Motion 6 was withdrawn and replaced with a Resolution authorizing the Executive Committee to file appropriate action with the State of Ohio to establish "Fictitious Names" allowing use by WBCCI of the names Airstream Owners RV Association, Inc. and Airstream Club International, Inc. The resolution was approved.

Motion 7 was to change Bylaws Article III, Policy, Item K regarding the duties of the International Rally Site Standing Committee. Under the revision, the committee is to formulate the basic requirements for an International Rally Site; seek, investigate and

evaluate potential sites and provide a list of potential sites to the International 3rd Vice President. All information will be kept on file at Headquarters. Motion passed.

Motion 8 was to revise Bylaws Article III, Section 3, concerning the composition of all Standing Committees to add a statement that this does not apply to the International Rally Site Committee and the International Rally Committee as their composition is defined elsewhere. Motion passed.

Motion 9 was to strikeout Bylaws Article III, Section 5, and replace it with a new section defining the composition of the International Rally Site Committee. The members of the committee shall be appointed to serve for a period of 4 years. Terms are staggered so that only a single member will be appointed each year. The incoming International 3rd Vice President shall appoint a member to serve. The International President shall select a member of the committee to serve as chairman. Proviso: Implementation of this Committee shall require the International President to appoint a member to serve a one year term. The International 1st Vice President shall appoint a member to serve a 2 year term. The International 2nd Vice President shall appoint a member to serve a 3 year term. Motion passed.

Motion 10 was withdrawn.

Motion 11 was to amend Bylaws Article III, Section 1 by adding a new Standing Committee as O. Long Range Planning and that Policy, Article III, be amended to insert a new item O defining the responsibilities of that committee. The chairman of the committee will be the International 3rd Vice President elected in the even-numbered year. The term of office for the Chairman shall be for 2 years. Two members shall be current Region Officers. Two additional members are to be appointed from the general membership. The International President and International 1st Vice President will be ex-officio members of the committee. Motion passed.

Motion 12 was withdrawn.

July 5, 2015

Motion 1 was withdrawn and replaced with a Resolution requesting that each International President provide a detailed financial report of the revenue and expenses of the Mid-Winter IBT Rally within 60 days of the end of the rally. The report should include a breakdown of the costs directly related to the business meeting(s) that are held at the rally. The resolution was approved.

Motion 2 was to revise Bylaws Article IV, Policy International Dues by deleting the current Articles B-F and replacing them with new Articles B-C. The revision applies only to new members and pro-rates the International Dues on a Quarterly basis. Dues for the

current year collected in the third and fourth quarter will also include dues for the following year. The change becomes effective January 1, 2016. Motion passed.

Motion 3 was to delete Bylaws Appendix 15, Unit Planning and Merit Award Application. This does not eliminate the Unit Planning and Merit Award Program but allows the Unit Planning and Merit Award Committee Chairman to update and revised the Program as needed without the formal approval of the IBT. The motion also included direction to update the instructions for filing to allow for electronic submission of the applicable forms. Motion passed.


